

## Religious Studies Curriculum Overview - Year 7

	Unit	Details
Autumn One	<b>Who inspires me?</b>	Pupils begin the year by looking at religion in action and reflecting on key religious and non-religious figures in society. They will evaluate how these figures were inspired by their own beliefs to achieve other inspiring feats. Pupils will have an opportunity to reflect on who inspires them in their own lives and how their own beliefs affect the way they live their lives.
Autumn Two	<b>What is Christianity?</b>	Pupils will build on the knowledge of Christianity as a world faith that they developed at KS2 by assessing key religious beliefs and practices of Christianity whilst understanding the variety of beliefs within the differing Christian denominations.
Spring One	<b>How was our World Created?</b>	Pupils begin this unit as a development of their study of Christianity but consider a range of views on how our world was created including non-religious and philosophical views. This knowledge is developed to consider the impact of creation stories on our daily lives and why cultures and faiths across the globe have a creation story.
Spring Two	<b>What is Hinduism?</b>	Pupils will investigate a major world religion in more detail than previously touched upon. They will develop an understanding of key beliefs and practices and consider what it is like to follow Sanatana Dharma in today's society.
Summer One		
Summer Two	<b>How does religion affect relationships?</b>	Pupils will consider religious and non-religious views on marriage, LGBTQ+ relationships and family to investigate the way in which following a world faith can impact life and relationships. This will build on the Christian and Hindu beliefs they have studied this year and consider how they are applied in action.
