

Spanish Curriculum Overview - Year 13

	Unit	Details
Autumn One	<p>Dosier de literatura: Réquiem por un campesino español</p> <p>Multiculturalism in Hispanic society - La inmigración</p>	<p>Pupils continue with their study of 'Réquiem' and analyse the relationship between characters and the development of themes. They critically evaluate the novel and develop their discursive essay skills.</p> <p>Pupils explore different aspects of immigration in Spain and the Spanish speaking world. Pupils will also discuss what problems illegal immigrants may face and hypothesise re: solutions.</p>
Autumn Two	<p>Aspects of political life in the Hispanic world: la dictadura de Franco y La Monarquía</p> <p>Multiculturalism in Hispanic society - El racismo</p>	<p>Pupils continue to examine the impact of the Spanish Civil war, deepening their understanding of both the film and novel, and build on prior learning from Y12 to describe what life was like during the Franco dictatorship. Pupils learn about the changes from monarchy and republic to dictatorship, the transition from dictatorship to monarchy and examine current attitudes towards the Spanish royal family. In this unit of work pupils discuss racist and xenophobic attitudes in the Spanish-speaking world, understand and discuss measures to combat racism and their effectiveness, look at existing legislation against racism and discuss possible new legislation.</p>
Spring One	<p>Aspects of political life in the Hispanic world: Los dictadores</p> <p>Multiculturalism in Hispanic society - La convivencia</p>	<p>Building on knowledge of the Franco dictatorship pupils learn about different dictatorships in the Spanish speaking world, with specific focus on Panama, Cuba and Chile.</p> <p>Pupils discover different ways cultures integrate in Hispanic society, the issues surrounding the integration of different cultures within the sphere of education and the coexistence of various religions in the Hispanic world.</p>
Spring Two	<p>Aspects of political life: Los movimientos populares y los jóvenes de hoy y los movimientos populares</p>	<p>In this unit of work pupils discuss the importance of politics in young people's lives, why their attitude to politics is changing, the unemployment situation amongst young people nowadays and how it is affecting them and to describe and discuss the type of society young people in the Hispanic world want to live in.</p> <p>They also consider the importance of effective protests and strikes and the role of trade unions. They draw on examples past and present to explain the significance and impact of social protests in Spanish speaking countries. This also helps to embed prior learning re: dictatorships, equality and racism.</p>
Summer One	<p>Repaso & Exam preparation</p>	<p>Lessons are dedicated to the revision of key language, structures and exam skills in order to ensure pupils are thoroughly prepared for all components of the A-level exam.</p>
